



Meadowdale Anti-Bullying Policy (2024/25)

We want to make sure there is **NO** bullying at Meadowdale!

What types of bullying are there?

Hurting: by pushing, kicking, hitting, pinching

Saying mean things including lies, bad names and talking behind their back



Leaving children out

Telling children to do things that are wrong

Using devices to say mean things or share photos

Saying or doing something about private parts of the body

Being mean about what people look like, who people like, what they wear, their home-life, what they believe or anything they see as different.

What will we do about bullying?

- Let your **parents and teachers** know
- **Talk** to everyone involved to find out exactly what is happening
- **Listen** to you and let you tell them how you feel if you wish to
- **Work** with all the children involved to find a way to get everyone to treat each other with respect and to be happy
- The child doing the bullying may have to do something to make it **right**
- If it happens **outside school** or on a device, we can do the same things to help to stop it.

To stop bullying, we will:

LISTEN to you

TEACH everyone what good behaviour is

HELP you to have fun at playtimes

Use the **SCHOOL COUNCIL** to ask you what we can do to help.

If you are being bullied or see bullying:

Stand up for yourself if you can—tell the bully to stop.

Tell a trusted adult - **every time** it happens - until it stops.

Remember it's **NOT** your fault and you are **NOT** alone

You can speak up and tell an adult if you see bullying happen.

Everyone at Meadowdale always tries their best to do the right thing with kindness.

We believe everyone is the same and should be able to be the best they can be.



We want everyone to treat each other with respect and to say 'NO!' to unwanted behaviour.

What is bullying?

It is when a child or group hurts or upsets another child or group on purpose and becomes more powerful. It usually happens more than once. It can be face-to-face or online such as in a game.
